General Description

The Video & Graphic Producer is in charge of the fast turn-around of short-form content including, but not limited to; sermon intro videos, short features, interviews, promos, motion graphics, announcement videos, and some long form stories. This role will include the leadership and oversight of volunteers including recruiting, training, scheduling, and management of this volunteer team.

Essential Job Functions

- 1. Champions the creativity of video and graphics by always searching for new inspiration, new content, and empowering team members
- 2. Acts as the primary architect for the creation of video and motion graphics, collaborating with the creative team & communications team for content and vision
- 3. Establishes repeatable systems and processes for the production of the video and motion graphic needs of Crossroads including, but not limited to, weekend services, mid-week services, special events, staff meetings, etc.
- 4. Expertly utilizes Final Cut Pro, After Effects, FCPX Adobe Primer, Photoshop, etc.
- 5. Understands and optimizes studio lighting and audio
