Discussion Questions for August 14th/August 18th

1. What were your personal thoughts about J. Warner Wallace’s message? What stood out to you the most?
2. What stood out to you most about the “abductive reasoning” process that J. Warner Wallace shared?
3. Read 1 Corinthians 15:12. What is Paul trying to teach the reader here? Why is this foundational to us as Christians?
4. Read John 19:31-34. What did we learn in the sermon about the details in verse 34? What was some of the evidence that our speaker presented arguing against Jesus not being dead when He was taken off the Cross?
5. What were your thoughts about the argument that J. Warner Wallace made against Jesus’s resurrection being a conspiracy? What elements do you need for a conspiracy to work?

6. Why do most people have an issue believing in the supernatural? Why do people write off the resurrection of Jesus as unreasonable?
