DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. Read Romans 8:24-25. What does this verse tell us that hope is? And what do we receive from our hope in His victory?
2. Read Hebrews 11:1-3. According to v.3, is our hope reliant on our ability to see and understand?
3. Read Romans 15:13. What is the significance of specifying that He is The God of hope?
4. Read Numbers 23:19 and Hebrews 13:8. How does this relate to the topic of hope?
5. Read Hebrews 6:11-12. According to these verses, how long does our hope last and why is it important to remember that?

6. Read Romans 5:2-5. What does hope do for our attitudes towards our situations? If our hope is tied to His promise and His promise is unwavering, then why do we tend to worry and stress so much in our trials? What does 1 Peter 1:6-7 tell us to do instead of worrying?

7. Read Hebrews 7:19. What does our hope allow us to do in relation to God our father?
