4. Read Amos 8:11-13. What is this an important reminder of? What would happen if every Christian stopped sharing the word of God?
5. Read Matthew 28:19-20. What are we called to do here (pay attention to each part of the verses)?
6. Pastor Chuck shared the following statistic, "70% of people facing a relational or mental health issue think of the Church as the first place they should go to get help." What are your personal thoughts on this? What were your thoughts on Crossroads becoming a place that is fully equipped to help people who are dealing with mental health issues?"
7. Read Matthew 25:34-40. What is Jesus teaching us in these scriptures? How does this relate to what we are focused on accomplishing as a church when it comes to mental health?
