## **DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:**

1. Share with the group: Are you a dog person or a cat person?
2. Share with the group something that God taught you or is teaching you during your personal Bible reading time.
3. What was your main take-away from what Pastor Chuck taught us through the movie *A Dog’s Journey*?
4. What makes relationships so difficult? What are the differences between a healthy and toxic relationship?
5. One of the things that we can’t escape in this life is people who will hurt us (physically/emotionally). As a group, read Isaiah 53:3-5. How does it make you feel knowing that Jesus experienced pain and suffering just like we do as humans? What type of emotions do you personally feel knowing that it was YOUR sin that nailed Jesus to the Cross?
6. Read Proverbs 11:29. Why is this scripture significant when it comes to the way that we treat our families? What are some examples of ways that someone can bring trouble onto their family?

7. Read Ephesians 4:31-32. What are we taught to do in this scripture? Why is it important to pay attention to the words that come out of our mouths when talking to others?
