Discussion Questions

**MEMORY VERSE FOR THE MONTH OF SEPTEMBER:** "The Spirit of the Sovereign Lord is upon me, for the Lord has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to comfort the brokenhearted and to proclaim that captives will be released and prisoners will be freed."

Isaiah 61:1 (NLT)

#### DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. Share with the group: Are you an early bird or night owl?
2. Share with the group: What is something that God taught you, or is teaching you, during your personal Bible reading time?
3. What was your main take-away from Pastor Chuck's message this week?
4. Read Isaiah 8:1-8. Isaiah is to name his son what is written on the sign that he is to write. What is the meaning of this name?
5. Read Isaiah 8:9-10. This refers to the remnant (the minority who would seek God and trust in God). What does Isaiah say will happen to them?
6. Look back at Isaiah 9:1-7. Now look at John 8:12. How do these passages compare and what does this tell you about how Jesus wants to affect your life?
7. Read Isaiah 10:1-4. What are the six things that God says they are guilty of. Do you see any of these things being done today by our elected officials? What does God say will be the result of their actions?

8. In Isaiah 10:20-34, God says that though there will be a time of devastation brought upon Israel, a remnant will be brought out of the ashes. The term remnant is brought about earlier in Isaiah, it is a group of faithful people saved by God through these painful times so they may carry on the lineage of the nation of Israel. Looking at verses 20-34, what does God promise this faithful group of people?
  
9. Read Isaiah 11:1-2 and Revelation 4:5. What are the seven ministries of the Spirit? Hint: The first is the “Spirit of the Lord” meaning the Spirit of Lordship. How are each of these ministries of the Holy Spirit to be active in our lives. Do you need one of them more than the others right now?
  
10. Read Isaiah 11:6-10. What will the earth will be like when Jesus (the root of Jesse) reigns on earth for 1,000 years. What stands out to you most and why?
  
11. Read Isaiah 12:1-3. Why should we give thanks to the Lord? What is God promising He will be to you when you commit your life to Him? What is your favorite promise in these 3 verses?
  
12. Read Isaiah 12:4-6. What are we to make known? Who do you feel you should make these very things known to? Read Philemon 1:4-5. How does this apply to why and how we should make known the deeds Jesus has done in our lives?

13. Read Isaiah 13:17-22 and Daniel 5:30-31. Cyrus the King of the Medo-Persian Empire took Babylon in 539 B.C. just as this and other passages prophesied. Isaiah looked to and told of the destruction by the Medes and then the ultimate destruction in the last days. How does knowing the accuracy of the Bible in predicting events such as the fall of Babylon and the coming of Jesus the first time make you feel about what is predicted about our days and our times?
