MEMORY VERSE FOR THE MONTH OF SEPTEMBER: "The Spirit of the Sovereign Lord is upon me, for the Lord has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to comfort the brokenhearted and to proclaim that captives will be released and prisoners will be freed."

Isaiah 61:1 (NLT)

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. Share with the group: When you die, what do you want to be remembered for?
2. Share with the group: What is something that God taught you, or is teaching you, during your personal Bible reading time?
3. What was your main take-away from Pastor Chuck's message this week?
4. Read Isaiah 14:1-3. What is God promising Israel? Read Deuteronomy 11:11-12. How does this apply to what you have read concerning God's love for Israel and her land?
5. God now shows Isaiah the Devil, whose name is Lucifer. Lucifer means "shining one." Read verses 12-15. What is the reason that God brought His judgement down on Lucifer? Pay special attention to the statements that begin with words, "I will."
6. In verses 13 we see a reference to the "stars of God." Read Revelation 1:20, what are the stars symbolic of? Now looking at Isaiah 14:13, what does Lucifer say in regard to the stars of God?
7. Look at Revelation 12:3-4. What do we see that Satan does in this passage?

8. Taking what you read in Isaiah 14:12-15, Read Revelation 12:7-17 as well as Revelation 20:7-10. What is the ultimate end that awaits the devil?
9. Now in Isaiah 14:16, God has Isaiah look again at the King of Babylon and the He will have Him look at the King of Assyria and the Philistine nation. They all were enemies of Israel. As a group, read verses 16-32. What stands out to you regarding the character of God and the judgement God will bring on those nations who stand against Israel and His plan for mankind?

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10. Look at what God tells us in Zechariah 2:8. By having faith in Christ and committing your life to Him, all of the promises God gives to Israel now apply to you. Knowing this, how does God see you? Do you personally claim these promises in your own life?
