Discussion Questions

**MEMORY VERSE FOR THE MONTH OF SEPTEMBER:** "The Spirit of the Sovereign Lord is upon me, for the Lord has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to comfort the brokenhearted and to proclaim that captives will be released and prisoners will be freed."

**DISCUSSION QUESTIONS**

1. Share with the group: What would you do if you knew you could not fail?
2. Share with the group: What is something that God taught you, or is teaching you, during your personal Bible reading time?
3. What was your main take-away from Pastor Chuck's message this week?
4. Read Isaiah 22:1-3. The people of Jerusalem are being surrounded by Sennacherib, King of the Assyrian Empire, and his army. They were now in the hands of the Assyrian Empire. Yet they were eating, drinking and partying like nothing was wrong. In what ways are people today choosing to indulge in pleasure yet moving toward destruction?
5. Read Isaiah 22:4-5. How did Isaiah feel about the destruction of his people? How have you become numb to those who are leading a life toward destruction or how has it moved you to action?
6. Has there been a time you can think of that God was letting something bad happen so He could get your attention? Are you willing to share with the group? What does God want us to do during those times?

7. In Isaiah 23 we learn that God was actually the One who planned and inspired the destruction of Tyre. In Ezekiel 28 we learn that Satan was actually the one who was the leader of Tyre and inspired the evil that went on there and spread throughout the world. Knowing this, what are we to learn about how God and Satan work? Do you think that there is a city today that Satan has as his headquarters to influence the world for evil?
8. Read Isaiah 26:3-4. What do these verses promise and what are we called to do so that this promise will be true for us? How does this promise apply to you when you are facing trials, tragedy or challenges?
9. What does Isaiah tell us in Isaiah 26:19-21? What are we promised? What does God want to hide us from? What will happen on earth while we are in heaven?
