MEMORY VERSE FOR THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER: "The Lord is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth. He will not grow tired or weary, and his understanding no one can fathom."

Isaiah 40:28

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. Ice Breaker Question: Complete the sentence, "I wish everyone could..."
2. Share with the group: What is something that God taught you, or is teaching you, during your personal Bible reading time?
3. What was your main take-away from Pastor Chuck's message this week?
4. Read Isaiah 57: 11-13. What does God tell those who are caught up in this evil? Will it profit them in the end? When they get into trouble will God help them? What does God promise to the one who does take refuge in Him?
5. Read Isaiah 58: 1-5.
 - a. What is the purpose of fasting?
 - b. The people are saying that they are fasting and God is not answering. In verse 2, how do the people see themselves?
 - c. In verses 3-5, how does God see them? Does this shed light on why God would not answer their prayers? Do you think that you ever miss out on answered prayer because you are not honest about who you really are and how you are acting?
 - d. Read verses 13-14. What does God promise those who keep the Sabbath correctly?

6. Read Isaiah 59: 1-2. What does God say He can do? What separates people from God and why will God not even hear their prayers?
 - a. Look at Proverbs 28:9, Psalm 66:18 and Ezekiel 14:1-6. What do these verses tell us?
7. Read Isaiah 59: 9-15. In this passage, Isaiah confesses their sins. Notice that Isaiah uses the word “us.” What does Isaiah say is the consequences of living and acting like this?
 - a. Read James 4:8-10. What does James say we must do to draw near to God and find healing and cleansing? Do you see that Isaiah is doing this?

8. Read Isaiah 61:1-3. This tells us what the Messiah (Jesus) would do when He comes the first time.
 - a. Now look at Luke 4:14-22; What do we learn about Jesus in both of these passages? What does Jesus tell us about Himself? What is unique to each passage?
